



# COMMUNICATION

Dear Parents and Carers,

As a school that sits at the heart of our community, we will always listen to your views and do our best to respond accordingly.

We were really appreciative of the large response we had to our recent parent survey. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive but there were some concerns raised around communication. You said that you felt there were too many platforms being used, which resulted in occasional confusion, duplication and lack of clarity. You also felt that the school website was not being used as effectively as it could be.

Therefore, from 31st October, when we return after the half term break, we will be changing the way we communicate with you all.

We will be using email as our main means of communication. It is more flexible than text messaging and we can attach letters and other important documents when necessary. This will make key information more easy to access. We will then upload all information to our school website - **www.annesleyprimaryschool.com** On the website, there are several "drop down menus" which host all the necessary information for you. There are curriculum documents, that explain the key knowledge we will be teaching the children though all subjects and all year groups. There are also class pages, under the "Children" drop down menu, that will be updated by the staff weekly. These pages will keep you informed of life within school and beyond. They will also help you to effectively support your child/ren's learning at home. Diary dates will be displayed on the "Calendar" menu, including holiday dates, Insets and upcoming events.

Newsletters will be published monthly and will be sent to you via email.

As we move forwards, the website will be our central means of communication with you all. Class Dojo will no longer be used but would be reinstated should we need to go back to remote learning. You may remember that this was the original purpose of Dojo in our school during the pandemic. It was a vital tool at a time when face to face communication wasn't possible.

Of course, class teachers will be available at drop off and pick up times daily.

# **Golden Book Assembly and the Tardis**


After half term, Golden Book assembly will take place one Friday a month at the new time of 2:30pm.
